The cranberry industry is beginning to stabilize its crop returns and many growers have begun replanting. The goal of this project is to determine if growers should be planting higher yielding cultivars with better resistance to diseases that are currently available. This project is too new to provide reliable data to the industry for that purpose. It is anticipated that recommendations to the industry will be available after the 2007 and/or 2008 harvest.
